

RESOLUTION SUBMITTED BY THE UNITED KINGDOM
Co-sponsored by KSA.

Concerning: Ethnic minorities and their integration in host societies.

The General Assembly,

- Acknowledging** That countries are facing severe problems from the isolation of ethnic minorities and the impact this has on the economy and the societal pressures this brings to all sides .
- Regretting** That this creates racial tensions that have adverse effects on the lives of the population as a whole and fearing the contribution to violent ethnic conflict that we've seen so much of over the past decade and a half across the globe.(Darfur, Congo, Croatia, Kosovo, France, Italy, UK, USA...) and that not enough is being done by the international community to ensure that ethnic minorities are protected and effectively integrated in host societies.
- Stating** lack of action taken on integration by the government of the UK and the EU countries on the ethnic minorities with their rights, for example; in education, employment and social rights in the society of the host countries and the understanding of the difference in cultures of the ethnic minorities.
- Highlighting** successes in integration of ethnic minorities in various countries where less common approaches were adopted like in Hungary in the mid-1990s - and more recently in Croatia and in Romania. Such as Specific rights, together with the resources that are required to put these rights into practice and the use of Parallel institutions for minority groups.
- Urging** The international community to put in place laws to help in the integration of minorities in governments to do more to help ethnic minorities from racial harassment, and to tackle high unemployment, and school exclusion rates among ethnic minorities this will also help boost the economy of these governments.
- Decides**
- 1) To ask members of the UN to establish laws on fostering integration of ethnic minorities.
 - 2)To create an International body to monitor the implementation of these laws.
 - 3) To Formulate a committee for each country that reports back annually on the status of integration.
